Board Review and Consideration to Change the June Regular Board Meeting Date
Background:

## **OPEB Liability Funding Strategy Discussion**

#### **Background:**

The District funds its retiree medical benefits, otherwise known as other post-employment benefits (OPEB), through biannual actuarial analysis and annual contributions to the California Employee Retirement Benefits Trust (CERBT). Our current actuarial used data from June 30 2021 to develop actuarially determined contributions (ADC) that the District will pay to the CERBT trust for FY 2023 and 2024.

The District 's actuary, Cathy MacLeod, has recently informed us that the unfunded OPEB liability calculation will likely see a substantial increase with the next actuarial report, which will have a measurement date of June 30, 2023, covering fiscal years ending 2025 and 2026. The anticipated increase is due primarily to the following:

- 1. On the liability side of the equation, CalPERS has updated and decreased the expected return on CERBT assets. When we prepared the 2021 valuation, the expected return was 6.4%. Using the updated projections applied to the 2021 valuation date, the projected return is 5.7%. The lower trust return/discount rate increases the District's liability by about \$270,000 over previous expectations.
- 2. On the asset side of the equation, based on the 2021 trust value and projected return at that time, we estimated the assets at the beginning of FY 22/23 would be \$2.33 million. Unfortunately, assets lost value and came in at \$1.84 million.

One option to address this is for the District to contribute additional funds to CERBT, however, this does not ensure that the funding level stabilizes in the long term. Instead, we discussed using the increased cash flow the District will see once the building is paid off in 2029, freeing up approximately \$300,000 per year. Until that time, it would be desirable to limit increases in OPEB contribution levels, while still maintaining full ADC funding, if possible.

Ms. MacLeod will develop ADCs for FYEs 2025 and 2026 in the new 2023 valuation. Depending on how those results shake out (expected to be higher but how much is unknown), we can extend the amortization period for paying down the new unfunded liability (UAL) which cropped up from a recent loss in plan assets coupled with a lower new discount rate.

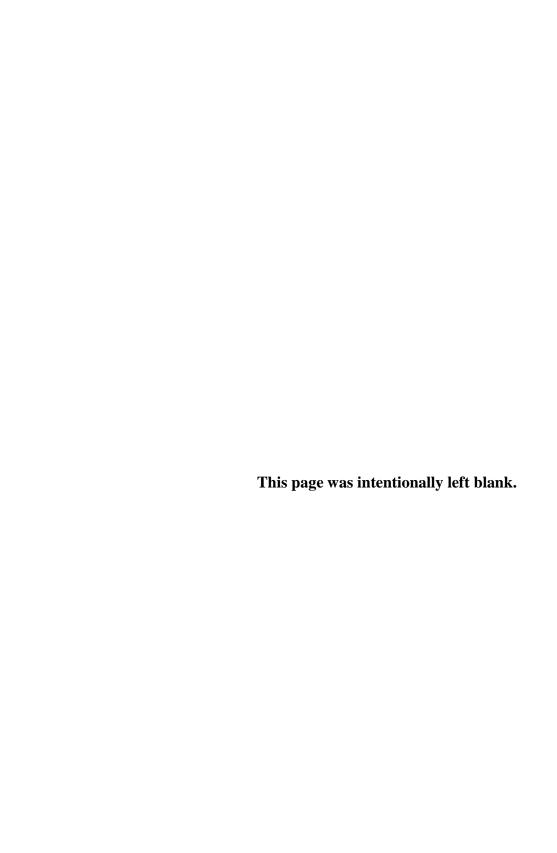

## Mosquito & Tick Surveillance

#### Adult Mosquito Abundance

- The summer traps runs are being set. This includes; Rice, Lincoln, West Roseville, East Roseville, Loomis, Auburn, Forest Hill, Thermalands and Colfax.
- Adult mosquito species currently being collected are mainly cool weather mosquitoes that do not commonly carry human diseases.

#### • Invasive Aedes:

 Surveillance for invasive Aedes started in April. There have been no invasive mosquito detections in 2023.

#### Vector-borne Disease Testing

 Vector species collected are being tested, zero positive mosquito samples (WNV,SLE,WEE) have been detected in 2023.
