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Board Review and Consideration to Add a Lead Vector Control Technician Position

In 2017, the District Board of Trustees passed resolution 2017-01 recognizing the vector control benefits of unmanned aerial systems (UAS). Since then, the District has become a leader in the use of drones for mosquito control. Over the next six months, we expect to receive two new application drones that we will put into operation in 2024. Considering the record-breaking West Nile virus (WNV) risk in California this summer, the added capabilities of the new UAS will help to address increased exposure of Placer County residents to WNV due to urban growth and expected strain to staff resources from continuing invasive mosquito infestations.

The new unmanned aircraft were purchased to enable the District to conduct regular mosquito control operations that augment our West Nile virus program and expand our ability to manage mosquito larvae in difficult to access areas in a more efficient and timely manner. This equipment further allows us to pursue more advanced operations such as mosquito adulticide applications, and operations to eventually reduce the size of treated areas while maintaining mosquito control efficacy. Bringing new unmanned aircraft into service requires significant training, test flights, and calibration by staff ahead of regular operations.

Our current drone team consists of a Supervisor and a Vector Control Technician II who splits his time between UAS operations and covering Zone 1 (Lincoln). Because we anticipate an increased frequency of UAS missions in 2024, this current staffing arrangement will not be adequate to cover the City of Lincoln as well as more drone ops. To address this issue, we propose this new Lead VCT – UAS position be filled through promotion of a current VCT-II, and a VCT-I be hired to backfill the vacancy.

Fiscal Impact

The impact of adding a new Lead VCT, and back filling the vacancy with a VCT-I will increase annual total compensation by approximately \$150,000 (5% of total compensation for the District) In FYE 2024 this would result in an increase of approximately \$100,000 for the remaining eight months of the fiscal year.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends the board approve the hiring of an additional Lead VCT to focus on field UAS operations effective immediately.





Mosquito Surveillance & Vector-borne Disease Testing

• Adult Mosquito Abundance




Figure 2: *Culex pipiens* adult mosquito count per trap night (purple line), compared to the three-year average (green bars) by calendar weeks. (Week 40 represents October 1-7)

- The abundance of *Culex tarsalis* and *Culex pipiens* show a downward trend the past couple of weeks (Figure 1,2). *Culex tarsalis* decreased substantially. In the past 6 weeks, they declined from an average of 42.7 female mosquitoes per trap night down to an average of 1 female mosquito per trap night.
- Anopheles freeborni showed a substantial decrease in the past 6 weeks, from the average of
 120 female mosquitoes per trap night down to an average of 1 female mosquito per trap night.





Figure 3: *Anopheles freeborni* adult mosquito count per trap night (brown line), compared to the three-year average (green bars) by calendar weeks. (Week 40 represents October 1-7)



• Invasive Mosquitoes

- Invasive Aedes surveillance continues to detect endemic populations of Aedes aegypti in the Cherry Glen, Hillcrest, and Thieles Manor neighborhoods in Roseville. We have caught 163 Aedes aegypti this season 80 of them were caught in September.
- Door to door inspections, additional trapping and adulticide and larvicide applications are being performed in response.
- We continue to trap at new locations in Western Placer but have not detected other populations.

• Vector-borne Disease Testing

- Mosquitoes: In 2023, 1767 adult mosquito samples have been tested for disease, 177 tested positive for WNV and 1 tested positive for St. Louis encepelitus (SLE).
- Dead Bird: In 2023, 150 dead birds have been testesed for WNV, 41 of them tested positive for WNV.

Operations

- Source Work
 - The number of service requests is decreasing as the season slows down. In the month of September Vector Control Technicians completed 79, compared to the 120 completed in August.
- Ground Treatments
 - 284 treatments to both adult and larval mosquito sources. Including 2 truck adulticide missions and 14 larvicide A-1 WALS applications for invasive mosquitoes.

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General Manager's Report

- Remembering Kelly Burcham. It is with great sadness that I report that Kelly Burcham passed away in September 2023. Kelly was one of the founding employees of the District. He came from Marin Sonoma Mosquito and Vector Control District in 2001 to Placer County with Charlie Dill to help establish the district and begin providing mosquito abatement services to Placer County residents. I remember fondly Kelly's stories of working out of Charlie's apartment during the early days of the District. Kelly was a key member of the Placer Mosquito staff until his retirement in 2017. Even after retirement, Kelly served the District as a retired annuitant working to transfer our paper-based treatment records into digital records until 2021. We offer our heartfelt condolences to Kelly's wife Kerry, his family and friends.
- Placer County Grand Jury Information Request The District received an email stating, "The Placer County Grand Jury is requesting each special district in the county to complete the attached document. Government Code Section 53235(b) requires each board member to complete ethics training. In addition, as required by the California Political Reform Act, each board member must complete and submit a Statement of Economic Interest, commonly known as Form 700. The information should be provided by the board's chairperson, or a person with the knowledge to complete the document. The grand jury requests that along with the attached document, certificates verifying the information provided." I have instructed the Board Secretary to fill out and return the form as requested.
- **Strategic Planning** is scheduled for November 14th in Rocklin. Lunch and snacks will be provided. Megan MacNee, Executive Director of MVCAC and AMCA will be facilitating.
- Monterey DART Symposium I will report on my participation in the event during the board meeting.
- **Replacement Trucks** The District is in the process of purchasing replacement Ford Rangers through Future Ford of Roseville. Due to the lack of new Ford Rangers (or equivalent ½ ton pickups) we have had to purchase used vehicles. The purchase price of the replacement trucks will be reimbursed up to \$50,000 each from the VCJPA auto coverage program. The two warrants for Future Ford listed on the Warrants for September are part of this transaction. I communicated with President Gayaldo email prior to purchasing the trucks with the understanding that it was not possible to wait for board approval ahead of the purchase because the dealership would not hold the vehicles that long. We agreed that I would bring the purchase documents for both trucks to the board for approval retrospectively at the November Board meeting.
