1.	To calibrate all application equipment using acceptable techniques before using, and to maintain calibration records for review by the County Agricultural Commissioner.
2.	To seek the assistance of the County Agricultural Commissioner in the interpretation of pesticide labeling.
3.	To maintain for at least two years for review by the County Agricultural Commissioner a record of each pesticide application showing the target vector, the specific location treated, the size of the source, the formulations and amount of pesticide used, the method and equipment used, the type of habitat treated, the date of the application, and the name of the applicator(s).
4.	To submit to the County Agricultural Commissioner each month a Pesticide Use Report, on Department of Pesticide Regulation form PR-ENF-060. The report shall include the manufacturer and product name, the EPA registration number from the label, the amount of each pesticide used, the number of applications of each pesticide, and the total number of applications, per county, per month.
5.	To report to the County Agricultural Commissioner and the California Department of Public Health, in a manner specified, any conspicuous or suspected adverse effects upon humans, domestic animals and other non-target organisms, or property from pesticide applications.
6.	To require appropriate certification of its employees by the California Department of Public Health in order to verify their competence in using pesticides to control pest and vector organisms, and to maintain continuing education unit information for those employees participating in continuing education.
7.	To be inspected by the County Agricultural Commissioner on a regular basis to ensure that local agency activities are in compliance with state laws and regulations relating to pesticide use.
Part II.	Environmental Modification

Fiscal Impact

The proposed amendment will have no net impact on the budget as it allocates budgeted expenditures in the same amount as anticipated increases in revenue. Board Review and Consideration to Approve Emergency Replacement of Roll-up Doors

Background:

In late September, one roll-up warehouse door at our Roseville headquarters stopped functioning due to worn bearings. This was one of the three most used roll-up doors and was original equipment that came with the building. We had added motorized operators for each of these doors about 10 years ago. We called Door 28 to assess the broken door as well as the other two motorized doors and discovered that all three had worn out bearings, and required replacement. The one non-operative door has been replaced, and the other two doors are on order.

We have attached an estimate from Door28. Please note that the non-operative door required immediate replacement since it was unable to be opened to allow vehicles to get out of the building. We have asked Door28 to order the remaining two doors, and contact us to arrange replacement.

Fiscal Impact:

This was an unforeseen maintenance issue. We are proposing a budget amendment (Resolution 2024-17) to fund this project.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommend the board approve the replacement of three roll-up doors as presented in the attached estimate not to exceed \$12,970.

Customer hereby agrees to execute and deliver to Door 28 such reasonable documents as are necessary to create or perfect such security interest.
- 4. <u>Default; Termination</u>. A default under this Agreement will occur if either party: (i) fails to perform any of its material obligations under this Agreement, (ii) files for bankruptcy, dissolution or for the appointment of a receiver, or (iii) fails to pay sums required hereunder when due. If such default is not cured by the defaulting party within ten (10) days for monetary defaults (or within twenty (20) days for non-monetary defaults) of notification by the non-defaulting party of such default, then an Event of Default shall occur under this Agreement and shall be cause for termination upon the non-defaulting party's written notice to the defaulting party.
- 5. <u>Customer Responsibilities</u>. Upon request and reasonable notice, Customer will furnish Door 28 with Certificates of Insurance evidencing the required insurance.

6. <u>Limited Warranty</u>; <u>Warranty Disclaimer</u>. Door 28 does not make any warranties with respect to the performance of the Services, or the parts and materials used in performance of the Services, beyond those described in Door 28's "Limited Warranty" (provided herewith and attached hereto). Door 28 specifically disclaims all warranties, express or implied, other than as described in the Limited Warranty. This Agreement allocates the risks of defect or failure between Door 28 and Customer. This allocation and the limitation of remedies and liabilities is recognized by both Parties and is reflected in the negotiated price for the Services, including parts and materials. Board Review and Consideration to Accept Updated Personnel Policy Manual

Background:

Staff have been working on revision of the District's Personnel Policy Manual since late last year. The revised manual presented includes legal updates from the District's labor counsel, incorporated comments from the Personnel committee, and has been reviewed by employees.

Here is a list of the main changes to the policy manual, this list does not include clarifying language changes, fixing typos, or formatting changes:

- 1.03 definition of harassment and discrimination has been updated to conform with legal requirements by adding, "reproductive health decision-making"
- 1.05(c) The requirement for employees to drive a district vehicle has changed to a minimum of no more than 3 points AND "Any employee who does not maintain a safe driving record will not be permitted to drive of behalf of the District."
- 2.x Prior Treatment nondiscrimination policy has been removed. This policy falls under general non-discrimination policies and has never been used previously.
- 2.x Pre employment screenings policy has been removed. This policy only applies to applicants seeking District employment, not existing employees. This policy will remain part of the District's recruitment and onboarding process.
- 6.06 Jury duty policy no longer requires employees to give the Districts fees received from the court for jury service.
- 6.10 Holiday schedule has been updated and a policy to provide full-time temporary employees with paid holidays during their period of employment has been added. The policy allowing the GM to grant special holidays has been removed.
- 6.11(a) Vacation accrual schedule has been updated
- 6.11(b) Vacation accrual cap has been updated to twice the annual accrual rate
- 6.11(f) mosquito season for purposes of vacation request policy has been clarified to be "generally from May through October"
- 6.12 The term Sick Leave has been changed to Sick Time to encompass both paid and unpaid periods of absence due to sickness, the need to care for a family member, etc.

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6.12 (d) Legal update of definition of family member for the purposes of taking sick time.

6.14 Updated "California Family Rights Act (CFRA) Leave" to comply with new legal requirements.

6.14 Clarifying changes for General (non-CFRA) medical leaves of absence.

6.15 Advanced notice to take Pregnancy Disability Leave is increased from two weeks to 30 days.

6.16 Updated policy for Lactation Accommodation to conform to new legal requirements.

9.01 Added a separate section containing existing requirements for Professional Conduct.

Mosquito Surveillance & Vector-borne Disease Testing

Adult Mosquito Abundance

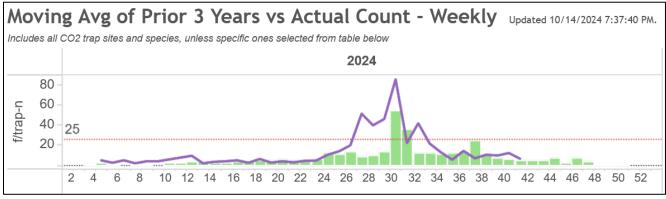


Figure 2: *Culex pipiens* adult mosquito count per trap night (purple line), compared to the three-year average (green bars) by calendar weeks. (Week 41 represents October 6-12)

- Culex tarsalis and Culex pipiens abundance has trended downward the past couple of weeks, this
 is a seasonal trend (Figures 1 & 2).
- Anopheles freeborni detections are consistent with the timing in previous years but are being collected at a higher abundance this year (Figure 3).

- o This year, we have collected Ae. aegypti in 15 neighborhoods and trapped 485 adult mosquitoes.
- Completed 20 parcel inspection plans covering 738 properties.

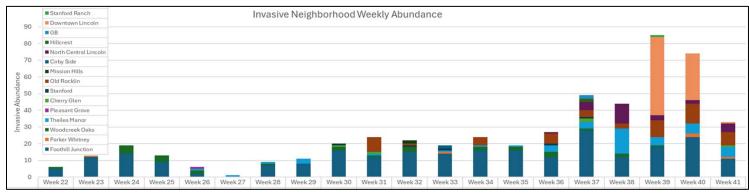


Figure 4: Number of Aedes aegypti adult mosquito trapped by neighborhood per week.

Catch Basin Treatments

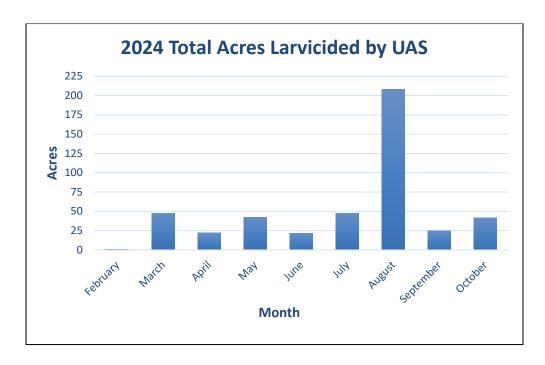
 In September, field technicians and assistants inspected 5,789 catch basins. Catch basins are a primary source of Culex pipiens, one of the major vectors of WNV.

- Treated 151 mosquito sources (non-stormwater)

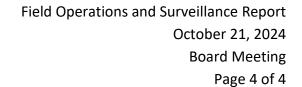

General Manager's Report

- Invasive Mosquitoes have become a serious concern in Placer County. In 2024, we detected invasive Aedes aegypti mosquitoes in 16 different neighborhoods and found at least two persistent infestations that have not responded to extensive eradication efforts. In addition, four travelacquired Dengue cases have been received by the District, and each case location, has been adjacent or within a neighborhood with active Aedes aegypti infestation. Over the winter, we plan to bring to the board a presentation summarizing the invasive mosquito situation in 2024 and discuss next steps to address the short- and long-term risks associated with persistent endemic Aedes aegypti populations in Placer County.
- Vestis (formerly Aramark) has been the District's uniform supplier for over a decade. Over the past several years, however, we have experienced increasing difficulty in receiving timely and complete uniform deliveries, regular errors in billing, and most recently, uniforms covered in a greasy substance delivered as clean garments. Technicians report there is so much grease on the clothes that it leaves a black residue on vehicle seats. As a result of this pattern of poor service, we are working to look at options to move to another uniform supplier. We expect that with the amount of grease on the clothing, we would likely need to replace some, or all the uniforms affected, and all the uniforms are showing wear. Jake has been working to develop options for switching to another provider and updating our uniforms at the same time. So far, he has received informal quotes from three service providers in the area. Due to the limited choices among the three potential prospects, one being our current provider, we believe an informal selection process would be beneficial in the instance compared to a full request for proposal.
- VecTec is a company that is developing an automated identification system for mosquitoes and ticks, and which the District has been partnering with for many years by testing, and providing feedback on their IDX benchtop mosquito ID system as well as their prototype system that has expanded the IDX technology into a field deployable auto counting and identification system as part of an adult mosquito trap. The District has recently provided letters of support to VecTec for grant proposals they are submitting to continue their research and development work.
- Administrative Policy manual project is being picked up again in response to new administrative
 task assignments and some key staff being out for various reasons this season. The District's
 admin team has started meeting weekly, to increase communication and coordination, develop or
 update standard operating procedures, and ensure that critical administrative functions are being
 completed in a timely manner.
